

GENEROUS GIVING IN DIFFICULT TIMES

Maybe it is time that we realize the privilege we have to be able to give back to God in thanksgiving for what God has done and continues to do for each of us.

Five Life-Changing Reasons to Become a Generous Giver to God's Work

1) Giving to God allows you to see God as your Provider

<u>1 Chronicles 29.16</u> O Lord our God, all this abundance that we have provided for building you a house for your holy name comes from your hand and is all your own.

<u>Psalm 24.1</u> The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it.

2) Giving to God allows you to overcome financial fears and worries

1 Kings 17:13-16 Elijah said to her, "Do not be afraid; go and do as you have said; but first make me a little cake of it and bring it to me, and afterwards make something for yourself and your son.

Genesis 28.20-22 Then Jacob made a vow, saying... "of all that you give me I will surely give one-tenth to you."

3) Giving to God allows you to bring God's order to your finances

<u>Deuteronomy 4:23</u> The purpose of tithing is to teach you always to put God first in your lives.

<u>Proverbs 3.9</u> Honor the Lord with your substance and with the first fruits of all your produce.

4) Giving to God allows you to fight the dragon of materialism

<u>Luke 12.15</u> "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." <u>1Timothy 6.10</u> For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains.

5) Giving to God allows you to experience more joy

<u>1 Corinthians 16.2</u> On the first day of every week, each of you is to put aside and save whatever extra you earn.

<u>2 Corinthians 8.2</u> During a severe ordeal of affliction, their abundant joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity.
