WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Shiloh requires that all entrants to the family life center and church building are fully vaccinated. While in the past we admitted entrants on the honor system, we have enhanced this policy. You are required to prove that you are <u>fully</u> vaccinated by showing your covid-19 vaccination cards.

PROCESS

Check-in procedures:

- Sign-in: Enter the facility wearing a mask; provide name and contact information
- Temperature check: Submit to temperature check by touchless thermometer (a temperature above 100 degrees is considered a fever)
- Prove Full Vaccination: Present your COVID-19 VACCINATION CARDS to the deacon or volunteer; you will then be guided to church school or worship service

ADDITIONAL POLICY INFORMATION

As part of the check-in process, you will be required to attest that you are not symptomatic and agree to engage in safe behavior.

WHAT IF I CANNOT PROVE I AM FULLY VACCINATED?

You will not be allowed to stay on the premises.
You will not be allowed to participate in Shiloh's choirs.
You may participate in ministry work; however, you will NOT be allowed on the premises.

A medical exception/exemption will require a doctor's note

DEFINITION: FULLY VACCINATED - FULL COMPLEMENT OF THE DOSAGE REQUIRED FOR YOUR CHOSEN VACCINE:

- PFIZER 2 SHOTS AND TWO WEEKS' TIME
- MODERNA 2 SHOTS AND TWO WEEKS' TIME
- JANSSEN (JOHNSON & JOHNSON) 1 SHOT AND TWO WEEKS' TIME

S H I L O H Re-Entry Guidelines Baptist Church

Though we have re-entered our sanctuary for in-person worship, services will still be livestreamed. If you plan to attend in-person worship services, below are some tips to help guide your re-entry through the COVID Screening Area in the Family Life Center (FLC):

- 1. Parking will be available in all our normal locations:
 - a) Angle parking on 9th Street
 - b) Shiloh's lot behind the sanctuary on Shiloh Way
 - c) Seaton School parking lot behind the FLC
 - d) Rhode Island Avenue median and curbside
 - e) Small lot at 1507 9th Street (Turner Bldg.)
 - f) Small lot at 1533 9th Street (WCS Bldg.)
 - g) Small lot in alley near the (FLC)
 - h) Curbside on surrounding streets

2. Entrance

- a) Enter Shiloh, wearing a mask, through the FLC:
 - Front lobby doors (1510 9th Street)
 - Rear lobby doors (Shiloh Way Alley)

Masks must be worn throughout the worship service and while you are in the FLC

- b) From both entrances, follow the directional placards to proceed to the COVID-Screening Area
- c) Those entering the FLC from the garage must proceed to the FLC Front Desk or the COVID Screening Area before entering Heritage Hall, the sanctuary, or the offices in the FLC
- d) Everyone seeking entrance must follow the COVID-screening process:
 - Show proof of vaccination
 - Have temperature checked
 - Fill out the Shiloh Contact Tracing Form COMPLETELY
- 3. Once COVID s<u>creening</u> has been successfully conducted, you may:
 - a) Attend Adult Church School (9:00 A.M.) via livestream in the Nursery (first floor FLC) OR,
 - b) Proceed to the sanctuary until the start of service (9:55 A.M.)
- 4. First Sundays (Communion):
 - a) Collect your Communion kits in the narthex/sanctuary lobby
 - b) At the end of worship service, discard your cup in the refuse can before you exit the sanctuary
- 5. <u>Seating</u>: Follow the directions of the ushers to be seated
- 6. <u>Tithes/Offerings</u>: You may:
 - a) Continue to contribute via eGiving, the Shiloh Apps, U.S. mail, FLC drop box, OR,
 - b) Drop your envelope(s) in a collection basket/plate during the Ministry of Giving

CHURCH COVENANT

PREPARATIONS for HOLY COMMUNION

(via Livestream)

²³"For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you, that the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread: ²⁴And when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me. ²⁵After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, this cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me." I Corinthians 11:23-25 (KJV)

In preparation for the celebration of Holy Communion, we recommend the following:

- 1) Prayerfully determine which items in your home you will use as your Communion elements (bread and wine).
- 2) Identify and cover a table or space to use as your Communion table. If possible, position your table near you as you watch or listen to the 10:05 A.M. worship service.
- 3) Place your elements on your Communion table and cover them before the start of service.
- 4) Toward the end of the worship service, Pastor Smith will let us know when he is ready to lead us in observing Communion. Please follow his instructions.
- 5) After Pastor ceremonially washes his hands, he will don a pair of gloves, and uncover the elements.
- 6) Uncover your chosen elements and take them in your hands for the prayer of blessing.
- 7) Follow Pastor's instructions as we commune together electronically.
